- Pre-existing illness/diagnosis

If the child in question has a chronic health condition as diagnosed by a Doctor, you can send them down any time when you feel it is warranted. All other students should try to stay in class. If the child has a headache and is requesting medication, I usually offer water and a snack first before I give medications. If the headache persists after trying these interventions, I will call their parents to get permission to give them medications.

Also, it is my understanding that Carey has set into place a system using the Walkie Talkie for recess. I ask that if a student is coming in from an injury at recess, that we utilize this system to notify the clinic a child is coming in. Also, an accident report should be started.
