MEDICATION ADMINISTRATION IN SCHOOL

- All non-prescription and prescription medications are to be administered from the health office by the school nurse or a trained personnel. This includes medicines such as eye drops, ointments, and antacids. Non-prescription medicines apart from Ibuprofen (Motrin) and Acetaminophen (Tylenol) will require a physician order.
- All medication must be in an original, labeled bottle, with the name of the child, the drug, and instructions on the label.
- If a non-prescription medication (over the counter) is to be administered, in a school setting, the requirement for prescription will apply except for Ibuprofen (Motrin) and Acetaminophen (Tylenol).
- The administration of Ibuprofen (Motrin) and Acetaminophen (Tylenol) will require permission via final forms. If permission is not given via final forms, parents will be required to bring desired medication in and administer it themselves. No verbal consents over phone will be taken.

Please contact the school nurse if you have any questions. Your child may self-carry an asthma inhaler, and or Epi-pen with the proper district paperwork filled out by doctors and parents. Forms are available in the nurse's office or in Final forms.

Please be sure to pick up any unused medicine from the nurse's office by the last day of school. Medication will not be released to students. **Medications must be picked up by an adult.** Any medications not picked up by the last day of school will be discarded by the nurse. Medications can **NOT** and will **NOT** be stored over the summer.
